ending of the Mass. A profound bow is made by everyone
during the Creed when we say the words "by the power of
the Holy Spirit He was born of the Virgin Mary and became
man." A profound bow is a bow of the head and shoulders.
A simple bow of the head is made before receiving Holy
Communion.

Genuflections: The new Roman Missal has nearly on
hundred pages of directives. One of those directives affects
us. From now on, parishioners genuflect to the Blessed
Sacrament two times: 1) on entering the church and, 2) on
departure from the church. Ushers and presenters of the
gifts are to bow to the small altar and they are to disregard
the Blessed Sacrament all during the Mass. We must listen
to Christ in the Scripture reading and renew the unbloody
sacrifice of Christ who becomes present on the altar of
sacrifice.
