

Paul also asks Timothy to keep in mind the future life with God who "dwells in unapproachable light." This is the blessedness of all those who, like Lazarus, were once poor but who are now rich.

The Archdiocese had an insurance audit of the Church and the other buildings. It was agreed to let Joe Schmelzle fix the electrical problems that the auditor found. Many other small jobs were also addressed, with the parish council to have a future workday to complete some of those.
