Why can't we all celebrate Mass in Latin?

You said we should offer Mass in several languages so everyone can participate. There is an alternative: the Latin Mass. In the past, all nationalities could attend and unite themselves to the sacrifice on Calvary without the barrier of vernacular. There is one God and one Church. There should be one Mass.

I'm writing this in the rectory of the Redemptorist parish in New Orleans. Across the street is St. Alphonsus Church, which was built for Irish- and English-speaking immigrants in 1847. Behind the rectory is St. Mary's Assumption, which was built for German-speaking immigrants in 1849. Two blocks from here is Notre Dame de Bon Secours, which was built in 1843 for French-speaking immigrants.

Until the 1960s, Mass was celebrated in Latin, but the preaching and music weren't necessarily done in Latin.

Latin has been an important part of the Catholic Church since the fourth century, but it's important to remember that language and ethnicity don't bind us—Jesus does.

I think we should do whatever we can to help people know Jesus. If celebrating Mass in Spanish, German, English, and French is going to bring people closer to Jesus, that's what we should do.

St. Mary's Church Maintenance Committee Notes

January 28, 2015

Members of the St. Mary's Church Maintenance Committee met with Tony Duever of CES Consulting, Marysville, and Gus Ponsting of MAP Co, Lincoln, Nebraska on Wednesday afternoon, January 28, 2015 at the church. MAP Co is owned by Mr. Ponsting; he specializes in architectural landscape design and was recommended as a resource by CES Consulting (Rob Peschel and Tony Duever) to provide design services to the project.

Committee members who were present were Brad Lueger (Chairman), Ferd Deters, Jerry Osterhaus, Elmer Ronnebaum, Mike Schmitz and Deborah Sudbeck.

The Committee Members and Tony and Gus toured the west and south sides of the church and then the north side.

The group then met in the rectory. Gus presented a portfolio of prior projects that he has been associated with.

Elevation surveys recently completed by CES Consulting were reviewed and discussed. Gus and Tony explained how projects such as St. Mary's should be approached, that is, with the first step being the surveying which is completed and then, development of a master plan.

There was a good exchange of suggestions concerning the goal of improving access to the basement bathroom and enhancing the appearance of the grounds on the south side of the church as well as the overall appearance of the entire campus with revisions of walkways, improvement in parking along the street, possible modifications to the steps from the street, improvement of the handicap ramp to possibly enter the main doors for better access, etc. These were all only discussion points; no idea was left unmentioned.

Tony Duever stated that MAP Co had agreed to complete a master plan within the original budget limit. That plan would be presented to the Committee for an initial review and possible modification or revision and then it would be advanced to the community.

It was the unanimous agreement of all the Committee members to have MAP Co and CES proceed with the development of a master plan.

The group returned outside for a further tour of the campus, mainly how to improve access from the church to the cafeteria and possible additional parking north of the grotto.
