## Why is Jesus' ancestry described inconsistently in the Bible?

Why is there such a difference between the genealogy of Jesus outlined in Matthew 1 and Luke 4:23?

Matthew wrote **his Gospel story first**. He was a Jewish man who wanted to tell his Jewish audience that Jesus was the long-awaited Messiah, the savior who had come. He **needed** to show that Jesus was part of the long tradition of the people of God, starting with Abraham, the father of the faith.

Luke was a Greek writing to Gentiles. He accompanied St. Paul on his many missionary journeys. His listeners and readers knew very little of Jewish culture and tradition. Luke wanted to show that Jesus had come as savior and redeemer of all races and all peoples. So he starts with Adam, the father of us all, and says salvation is now universal. Your last name and skin color are immaterial.

This belief of universal salvation will reach its fullness in the doctrine of the Mystical Body of Christ, in which all of us are included. Christ is the head, and we are the members of the one body that is the Church.
