MARRIAGE MINUTE-May 29

Have you ever wondered how to fix the marriage issue in our culture? Is it a coincidence that as we have moved away from God and his help, grace, that marital happiness has declined as well? Look at this from the Catechism of the Catholic Church. "To heal the wounds of sin, man and woman need the help of the grace that God gives in his infinite mercy, never refuses them. Without His help, man and woman cannot achieve the union of their lives for which God created them "in the beginning." (CCC 1608) This Sunday's readings are all about the Eucharist, which is the Source of all grace. If we want more happiness in our own marriage or to truly help someone else in their marriage, let's connect more often to grace through the Eucharist, Confession, prayer, and practice more virtue which disposes us to grace. And help others do the same.

DEAR PADRE--May 29, 2016

Is taking just the host full participation? Do we need both bread and wine to receive Christ's Body and Blood? If I receive only the host—not the Precious Blood—am I participating fully in the Eucharist?

By only taking the host you are participating fully. In the same way, if you only drink from the chalice you are participating fully. Jesus is always fully present in each form—both one and the other. Many times it is not possible to offer the chalice to a large congregation; yet there are also times when one cannot receive the host, especially in sickness, and consuming the Precious Blood is easier. In its teaching on the Eucharist, the Church invites us to receive both: "It is especially fitting to receive Christ in both forms during the celebration of the Eucharist. This allows the Eucharist to appear more perfectly as a banquet, a banquet that is a foretaste of the banquet that will be celebrated with Christ at the end of time when the Kingdom of God is established in its fullness (see Eucharisticum Mysterium, 32)." In John 6 Jesus invites us to both eat and drink, so it is good to do both if you are able. If you aren't able, or if the chalice isn't offered at your church, you still participate fully. Parishioners Encouraged to Attend Recital at St. Mary's Church in Recognition of the 100th Anniversary of Historic Pipe Organ

All parishioners are encouraged to attend the Organ Recital next Sunday, June 5 at 4 p.m. This recital is being presented in honor of the 100th Anniversary of the organ. The concert will be one hour long and will be performed by Kevin Kissinger.



Kevin Kissinger graduated from the UMKC Conservatory of Music with a Bachelor of Music in Organ performance. During that time he won the Missouri Music Teachers National Association (MTNA) and Kansas City American Guild of Organists (AGO) organ competitions. His past positions include organist for the Pontifical Choir at the Cathedral of the Immaculate

Conception in Kansas City, Missouri. Kissinger has concertized throughout the United States, including recitals in Connecticut, Massachusetts, Utah, California, and numerous cities in Missouri and Kansas. In 2004, Kevin performed one of his own organ compositions on the PipeDreams Live (national) radio program. He has concertized at conventions including the American Institute of Organbuilders in 2002 and 2004, the American Guild of Organists in 2003, and the Organ Historical Society in 2005. Kevin is currently organist at Our Lady of Good Counsel Church in Kansas City, Missouri and a staff organist at the Community of Christ world headquarters in Independence, Mo.

Kevin tunes and services pipe organs throughout this area and is an authorized servicer for Quimby Pipe Organ Company of Warrensburg, Mo. Quimby Pipe

Organ Company restored the organ at St. Mary's Church in 1983.

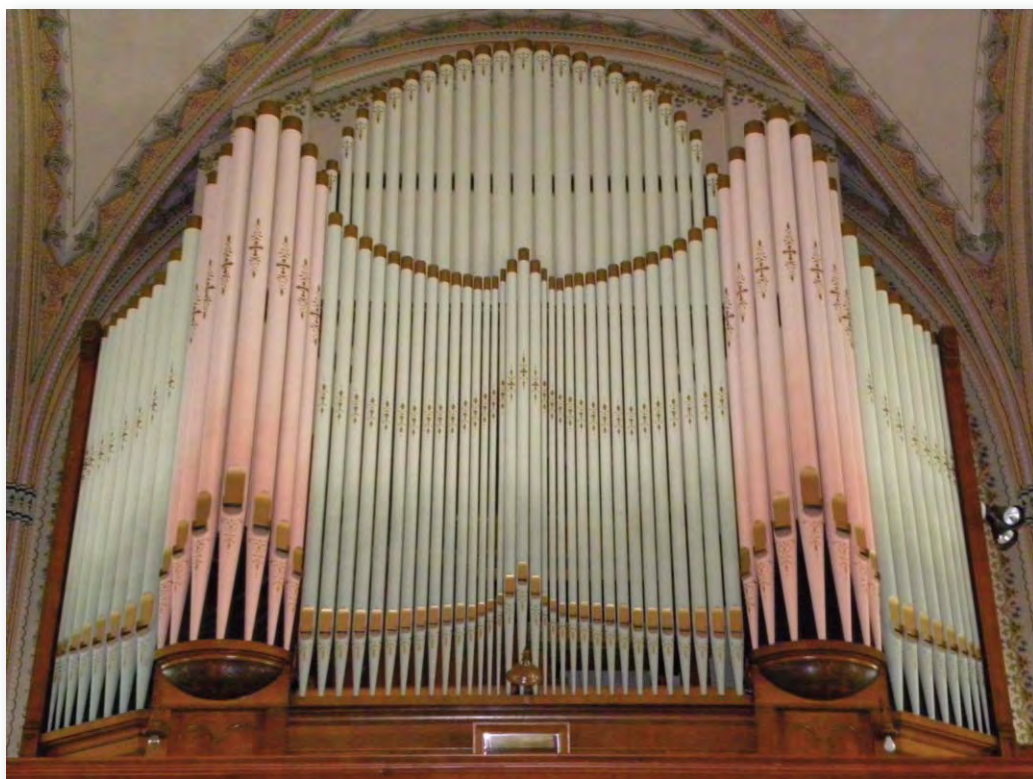
The Hinner's Organ Company produced many organs that were installed across America. The organ at St. Mary's Church reportedly cost about \$4,000. Kevin says that a comparable instrument today would cost at least \$400,000. The Hinner's Organ Company stopped production just prior to WWII as other manufacturers had more automated processes and could produce organs at lower costs.

Again, the recital will be Sunday, June 5 at 4 p.m. Father Ed will introduce the program.

A reception will follow the recital in the parish hall. The event is open to the public. Parishioners are encouraged to attend.
