MARRIAGE MINUTE -June 19 How do our children experience the tangible love of God? Pope Francis reminds us in "Amoris Laititia" of the importance and dignity of being a parent when he said, "The love of parents is the means by which God our Father shows his own love."

Aside from the obvious mission of participating with God in the creation of life, each parent has a daily mission to make God's love concrete by the way they love their children. Spending quality time, providing food and shelter, teaching virtue and morals, showing affection, offering forgiveness, and even using proper discipline are all ways children grow into the experience of God's love. As we celebrate Father's Day, take stock of the qualities your dad or husband have that reflect God the Father, and be aware of the noble mission of Fatherhood. Especially in this year of Mercy, remember that no earthly dad is perfect.

DEAR PADRE-June 19, 2016

What if we can't conceive? How far is OK to go when dealing with infertility?

Catholic teaching holds that procreation, along with the love expressed between spouses in the sexual act, is one of the principal ends of marriage. The act itself is holy within that context, and the resulting children are a fruit of that love and a gift—not a right of every couple. Most of us know couples who are unable to conceive. Sometimes a technique or medication can help, but not always. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that, "techniques that entail the dissociation of husband and wife, by the intrusion of a person other than the couple (donation of sperm or ovum, surrogate uterus), are gravely immoral.... Techniques involving only the married couple (homologous artificial insemination and fertilization) are perhaps less reprehensible, yet remain morally unacceptable....Only respect for the link between the meanings of the conjugal act and respect for the unity of the human being make possible procreation in conformity with the dignity of the person" (CCC 2376-77, see also Donum vitae). Infertility treatments such as in vitro fertilization (IVF) not only depersonalize the sexual act but also carry the greater problem of the disposal of the fertilized but unused embryos, which are real human beings. When judging an act, we must consider our intentions and the act's nature and ramifications.
