Pastor's Desk

Epiphany of the Lord

This weekend, almost in all the churches, people will sing "We Three Kings." The song "We Three Kings" details the gifts of the Magi, but do you know what you're singing?

"Born a king on Bethlehem's plan, gold I bring to crown Him again." This one is the most straightforward - gold symbolizes the Kingship of Christ.

"Frankincense to offer have I. Incense owns a deity nigh." In many religious traditions, incense symbolizes prayers rising to heaven. In some pagan traditions, it is thought to help "call down" the deity. The gift of frankincense symbolizes Jesus' role as the Great High Priest, sanctifying the world through his sacrifice.

"Myrrh is mine: its bitter perfume breathes a life of gathering gloom." Myrrh is an embalming spice. Already at Christ's birth, we have the symbolic reminder of his death.

Sacramental Statistics for 2018

Very often our fondest memories of growing up Catholic revolve around sacraments. We remember the First Holy Communion day most likely when we were in 2nd grade; the splash of water during the Baptism of a child; the hand of our sponsor on our shoulder as we were confirmed and tears at a wedding or funeral Mass. Sacraments are at the heart of the Catholic life. A sacrament is a sacred sign by which we worship God. Simply put, the sacraments are signs or symbols of God's love and presence enriching our faith.

As a faith community, besides Eucharist, Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick, we celebrated many other sacramental moments: Baptisms, First Communions, Confirmations, Wedding and Funeral Masses. Chalking the Door

Do you remember seeing this inscription **AD 20+C+M+B+18** on the door post of any house last year? This stands for Anno Domini (the year of the Lord) which is now 2019; Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar, the names of the 3 Kings. Depending on the source, the letters may also mean Christus Mansionem Benedicat, Latin for "May Christ bless this house." There is a practice dating back to the middle ages of etching this inscription above one's front door for the feast of the Epiphany and reciting a prayer, that all who cross the marked threshold will enjoy Christ's goodness.

We are encouraged to place this inscription over the front doorway this weekend, the feast of the Epiphany. It is usually done in chalk or it can be printed on a small paper and placed over the front door of your home. The following prayer can be prayed as the inscription is placed over the doorway. **May God, who provided a safe dwelling for the eternal Word, bless this home and all who live here, through Christ our Lord, Amen.** Then Holy water may be sprinkled around the entry way of your home. This simple devotional practice on the feast of the Epiphany connects Jesus' early home with every Christian home. It contributes to blessing the people who come into and go forth from the home throughout the year.
