SEEDS OF FAITH

There is a brevity, a certain terseness, in the scripture readings for Easter Sunday. Peter's speech in Acts is built of direct, pointed sentences. Paul's letters are based on straightforward creed-like statements. Even the Gospel story only briefly recounts what will turn out to be one of the most remarkable events in human history—the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Advertising agents call these encapsulated points of information “bullet points.” Scripture scholars call them kerygmata, or “kernels” of our faith.

Actually, “kernels” or “seeds” are good terms for these statements, since throughout the Easter season, we will hear in the Acts of the Apostles, the Letters of Paul, and the Gospel accounts of the days following the Resurrection exactly how these kerygmata began to flower, how they continued to grow through the life of the early church.

May these Easter “seeds” of faith serve a similar purpose for us, too, so that the life of the Risen Christ will flourish in us and through our witness in the coming days. - Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

The Orthodox greeting

The orthodox Christians have the custom of greeting one another during the Easter season by saying, “the Lord is risen,” and then the response is “he is truly risen.” That’s the reason we are celebrating today — because Jesus is truly risen.

The resurrection of Jesus is at the heart of our faith as Christians. We celebrate this mystery every time we gather on Sunday, the Lord’s day, to celebrate the Eucharist.

How is the resurrection of the Lord related to transition or change? In general, we don’t like change; we are fearful and like the status quo. Uncertainty or crisis can happen because of transitions. Change causes stress and too much stress can lead to health problems. Think about all the changes we have experienced since covid19 pandemic at the global level, in the Church, in our parish, and in our own lives.

We need “resurrection lenses” to live the Christian life. Without these lenses, we become fearful and anxious in times of change. We need “resurrection lenses” to grow and thrive in transition. The Lord wants us to see clearly that he is risen & he is with us as we navigate through these changes in our life.

Jesus’ disciples experienced the ultimate “transition” when he suffered, died and rose again. Jesus is now risen and lives with us. He can help us at all times. He has won the victory over sin and death. We do not need to be fearful or anxious in times of change because we have a stable core, a center, and that center is the resurrection of the Lord. He is risen! He is truly risen!


