Saint Simon and Jude, Apostles (October 28)

Saint Jude, apostle and . . . Hollywood success story? Indeed! Beyond Simon's being a "Zealot" for Israel's liberation and Jude's question about Jesus revealing himself (John 14:22), no historic facts are known about either saint. But Saint Jude's well-known patronage of lost causes and hopeless cases is largely due to a desperate vow made just before World War II by a struggling entertainer, the son of Arab-American immigrants, Danny Thomas. Unemployed, his wife about to give birth, Danny, attending Mass, impulsively donated his last seven dollars to the collection, promising: "Saint Jude, if you help me find my way in life, I will build a shrine in your honor!" Older Americans remember well Danny's long, successful movie and television career. Grateful parents worldwide know the miracles that have taken place for fifty years at his Saint Jude Children's Research Hospital, where needy children are cared for regardless of race, religion, or financial resources, and monumental advances continue in healing and preventing pediatric cancers and catastrophic childhood diseases. St. Mary's Church Cemetery Beautification Project

Memorial Trees — For a Living Legacy

St. Mary's Cemetery Committee welcomes people to remember loved ones by supporting the planting of a Memorial Tree. When a memorial tree is planted in memory of someone who has died, you create a living legacy that honors their life. This is a beautiful tribute that can also be a meaningful gift — a "living memorial".

Ivory Silk Lilac trees have been recommended by Blueville Nursery to be planted along the south side of the cemetery.

Some information about the Ivory Silk Lilac tree is as follows: With a pleasing form and compact size, an "Ivory Silk" Japanese lilac tree reaches 20 to 30 feet in height at maturity and spreads 15 to 18 feet in width. Young trees show an oval to pyramidal form. As the tree grows and matures, it fills in to take on a fuller, more rounded shape. A popular boulevard tree, "Ivory Silk" works well as a specimen tree, buffer or screen.

Flowering Habit: Blooming in early summer, "Ivory Silk" boasts showy blossoms that are its principal ornamental feature. Its tiny springtime blooms, quite different than its shrubby relatives, cluster in creamy white panicles. While fragrant, they don't share the scent often associated with the shrubs. The sweet smell draws many pollinators to the tree's blooms. Normally a profuse bloomer, Japanese tree lilacs may fluctuate in their blooms from year to year.

The trees are approximately 10 feet tall. If you are interested in supporting the beautification project with a Memorial Tree, please contact Mary Beth Haverkamp or a Committee Member. The goal is to plant 10 trees this fall. The cost is \$300 each. Or you may use the form below and forward it to the Rectory. Donors and those honored will be displayed in the Cemetery Directory.


