From the



Pastor's Desk

This is the penultimate Sunday of the liturgical year. Coming to the end of the liturgical year provides a good opportunity to look back at the past year and take stock, acknowledge, and thank God for all His blessings and gifts. These days are also a time to reflect upon and account for the ways in which we have used or neglected those gifts.

The parable of the talents we read in our Gospel today fits the call of these days. The traditional interpretation of the parable instructs us that we have all been blessed with various talents and gifts, and the challenge is to reflect upon how we use and cultivate them.

As we grow in our faith, we learn to appreciate the spiritual gifts that we have been given. We are called to unlock our spiritual talents and put them to good use lest they might gradually wilt away. It may be that we have a gift for prayer or a special concern for social justice or a gift for teaching or for some other spiritual quality. All of us in the Church today have received at least one talent namely, the gift of Faith. We need to "trade" with our talent of Christian Faith. Our responsibility is not just to preserve and "keep" the Faith, but to work with it. We need to promote and add value to the Faith by living it out. The way to preserve the Faith, or any other talent that God has given us, is to put it to work and help it bear fruit. - Fr. Regie

Plenary Indulgence

During the month of November, the Church has 2 traditional means of obtaining a plenary indulgence for the souls in purgatory - to visit a cemetery and to pray for the dead during the Octave of November 1 to 8.

A Catholic who wishes to obtain a plenary indulgence must also fulfill the ordinary conditions of an indulgence, which are sacramental confession, reception of the Eucharist, and prayer for the intentions of the pope (Our Father & Hail Mary). Sacramental confession and reception of the Eucharist can occur within a week of the indulgenced act.

The second plenary indulgence is connected to the Feast of All Souls' Day on November 2, and can be received by those who piously visit a church or oratory on that day and recite the Our Father and the Creed.

According to the Vatican, both indulgences have been extended and are available to Catholics throughout the month of November to reduce crowds.

Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne (1769-1852) November 18

Pope Benedict once declared himself struck by how remarkably diverse our American saints are—some native born: Mother Seton, Katherine Drexel, Kateri Tekakwitha; most, like many Catholics today, immigrants: Padre Serra, Bishop Neumann, Mother Cabrini, Rose Philippine Duchesne. When the French Revolution that dispersed her convent ended, Rose joined the Religious of the Sacred Heart, volunteering for their United States mission, opening the first free school west of the Mississippi. Only after lengthy service as Superior did Rose—now seventy-one—realize her life's dream, undertaking a mission among the Potawatomi Indians. When some worried about her advanced age and failing health, the Jesuit mission leader overruled them: "She must come! She may not be able to do much work, but she'll bring the mission success by praying for us!" Frustrated by her inability to learn their languages, Rose nevertheless "spoke" to the Native Americans by her prayerful presence before the tabernacle. "Quah-kah-ka-num-ad," they named her, "Woman-Who-Prays-Always"—their way of bestowing the title the Church would later make official: saint! - - Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

Unify, don't divide. Our goal is always to build others up and bring them to God. If what we want to say is loving, instructive, and healing, it may be okay to speak. Otherwise, if it will cause unnecessary conflict or make someone else look bad, it's better left unsaid.
